

Kabng'etuny Women in Coffee



Over 330 women have formed a co-operative of coffee growers in order to support their families and pay for school fees.



- Joyce and Rachel are two women in **Ndubusat** who have joined the Kabng'etuny Women in Coffee group.

- The coffee **yields have doubled** and in addition the group of women are also able to focus time on vegetable cultivation, poultry rearing and eggs, all of which they sell at the local market. Joyce and Rachel say they have seen the numbers of women increase at the weekly market selling produce grown on their farms.



- The group not only support each other in coffee growth and making money to support their families but also provides them with an opportunity to discuss different issues that affect each community, it **empowers each of the women** to find ways to overcome the daily challenges of life.



- The support and healthy homestead facilities they have received through Brighter Communities Worldwide has **freed up over 3 hours a day** of their time, so that Joyce and Rachel are able to tend to their crops.



Joyce and Rachel say that interventions from Brighter Communities Worldwide of access to clean water, Lifeskills courses, access to health services and healthy homesteads have given them the time, confidence and skills to join the womens coffee group.
