KENYA BALL ' 07

On Saturday 14th April at the Rochestown Park Hotel 340 friends and supports of the Cork based Charity Friends of Londiani gathered at their flagship event to celebrate the last five years of Friends of Londiani in style.





Guests of honour on the night were Deputy Lord Mayor Ciaran Lynch and his wife Bernadette, The Principal Councillor from the Kenyan High Commission in London Mr. John Tipis, The First Secretary from the Kenyan High Commission in London, Mr Leonard Boiyo. The event was also attended by Mr. Pat Cox, former President of the European Parliament whose wife Cathy is a member of the team going to Kenya for 6 weeks this summer to participate in Harambee 2007.

Guests were welcomed by the sound of African drumming from the "Londiani Drummers", and a champagne reception.

Deputy Lord Mayor Ciaran Lynch opened the evening by welcoming everyone to the Kenya Ball. He spoke of the mission of Friends of Londiani, and the latest Harambee project in June. "The Irish people can proudly claim to have a longstanding and proud record when it comes to providing Development Aid. And

not just in times of today's prosperity but also when times were not so good."

He acknowledged the world of Friends of Londiani in improving the quality of life of the people of Kenya. "The work carried out by FOL through fundraising here in Ireland and in Kenya through the implementation of a vast range of projects has without question added to the quality of life of countless families and communities."

He also spoke of twinning places in Ireland with places in Kenya so there may be opportunities in the future for Londiani! He concluded by paying tribute to all the volunteers who will be contributing their time and expertise to the many projects that will be implemented this year.



The Principal Councillor, Mr John Tipis spoke of the welcome that the people of Londiani and of Kenya had for the Friends of Londiani. He acknowledged that the projects implemented by FOL were in line with the policies of the Kenyan Government in the areas of Health, Water, Education and HIV/AIDS. He commended FOL on contributing to the reduction of the prevalence of HIV/AIDS in the region through their education programme. Mr John Tipis presented Maria Kidney, Chairperson with a donation from the High Commissioner in London, Mr Joseph

Muchemi in recognition of the work done by Friends of Londiani. This acknowledgement was gratefully received by all present.

Maria Kidney, Chairperson and Martin Ballantyne Financial Director of Friends of Londiani gave a presentation on the last five years of Friends of Londiani and its major milestones. They also outlined the hopes of Harambee 2007, and acknowledged the support of all present in helping to fulfil these hopes. They spoke of the vision of Friends of Londiani for the next 5 years:

We will continue to work with the communities in the area of Londiani.

We will strive to complete sustainable community projects in these areas.

We will create a model of development which works in these areas and transfer this to the new areas in which we will work.

We will continue to align our goals with the Millennium Development Goals to ensure that the work we complete fits into the "bigger picture" of global development.

Maria described the development of Friends of Londiani as a snowball falling downhill, gaining momentum as it travels and gaining in size and strength. As the snowball travels it grows and joins with other

snowballs in the same way that Friends of Londiani has reached out to more and more people over the last 5 years, and will continue to reach out for as long as there is a need.

Maria and Martin concluded by thanking all present for their continued support and help with the work of Friends of Londiani. Guests were given the first viewing of the new DVD outlining the work of Friends of Londiani which is now available.

Music was provided by "The Boogie Band" and Ted Dunne, and the dancing continued into the night. The party atmosphere was fantastic and a great night was had by all.

Tax Relief Benefits

Since **April 1st 2007**, Friends of Londiani are eligible for the tax relief under the Designated Charities scheme. Under this scheme we will be able to obtain a refund on the tax paid by individuals who are taxed under the PAYE tax system. This means the value of your donation will be increased, for example if you donate at least €250 (minimum qualifying amount) in the tax year and paid tax at a rate of 42%, Friends of Londiani is entitled to a repayment of €181 making your total donation €431. Similarly the total value of a donation if you paid tax at a rate of 20% is €312.50. This applies to all donations since 1st January 2007.

Christmas Cards & 2007 Calendars

Peoples generosity knows no end and this Christmas people really showed their support for Friends of Londiani all around Ireland through the purchase of our packs of Christmas Cards and Calendars for 2007.

We had 'sales days' in many places thanks to our volunteer collectors. This year we had two versions of the Christmas cards available and seven different kinds of gift vouchers.

Total proceeds on cards and calendars = €11,500

Total from gift vouchers = €3,610

Total donations at Christmas = €13,000

Together we sold 1265 calendars and 3827 cards

Latest Updates from Kenya ~ April 2007

Members of the Harambee 2007 planning team visited the projects in Londiani, Ndubusat and Benditai in February to make preparations for Harambee 2007 and also to monitor progress in the ongoing projects.

Bethel Children's Home

Two new children have arrived in the home since we visited in February. Kevin is one month old and Cephas is 4 years old. This brings the total number of children in the home to 67.

Bethel Medical Clinic, Ndubusat



The registration process for the clinic in Ndubusat is almost complete. We hope to have the final hurdle crossed by the end of March. We have hired a new Nurse there, Steven, who was a student on our education bursary scheme and qualified late last year. This allows a better staff rota to be implemented which is more sustainable.

Ndubusat Primary School

Ndubusat Primary School is looking and doing really well this year. The results and enrolments have all improved. The Ministry of Education has agreed to fund 2 new classrooms through the Community Social Fund scheme which is a great reflection on the hard working team there. Progress in the school has improved since the partnership with FOL has developed. According to Charles Bii, the School Headmaster: "In the years 2004 – 2005, the performance of the school improved greatly. This was due to your effort in financing the renovation of the wooden buildings and the completion of the permanent classrooms. Thanks to friends of Londiani (FOL for the assistance. classrooms now are warm and motivating to learners. We expect more improvement this year."

The school has enjoyed a steady increase in enrolment due to improved facilities which in part

they attribute to their improved facilities and resources.

Ndubusat Secondary School



Ndubusat Secondary School has started to take in students! It now has 16 first year girls who began school in January. They are using the wooden school until the new school is ready. Work has begun on the dormitory and the latest news is that it is already up to window level. The school committee has worked really hard to make progress with this project.

Education Bursaries

It is that time of year again when FOL will distribute education bursaries to the most needy of the villages in which we work in. We have increased the number of bursaries this year to 20. There are students studying in Secondary school, and also students in Tailoring, Carpentry, and Building.

Water Projects

The water project continues, and work will shortly begin on the dam to maintain the Ndubusat Water Project.



Peer Education

The Peer Education project continues, and a new course is now been run in Benditai village. The various



women's and men's group have all been registered with the Ministry of Health and are continuing the education. 3 new groups have been set up:

FOL Kenya

We have hired two more staff members in FOL Kenya on a 6-month contract to help with all the preparations necessary for Harambee 2007.

Harambee 2007

The team for Harambee 2007 was selected last September and has almost completed their training and preparations for this summer. The group is made up of 90 people from all over Ireland and includes two Australians! There have been two training weekends so far and currently preparations are underway for the third and final training weekend.



Friends of Londiani are delighted with the number and calibre of participants and are confident we will achieve our aims and objectives.

The first training weekend was held in An Spidéal, Galway and in between the sunshine and western gales, the team completed a variety of tasks and

trainings. This included some outdoor teambuilding and gaining an understanding of the tasks ahead. Our thanks to An Crúiscín Lán Hotel, An Spidéal for their hospitality.

In March the team congregated in Cobh, Co. Cork and continued where they left off in Galway with another series of trainings to prepare for the tasks of the projects. A special thanks to Paddy the builder who taught the team how to build a wall in Castlemartyr! Also thanks to the staff and management of the Rushbrook Hotel, Cobh for providing us

with an excellent venue.

There will be three travel groups this summer:

June = 28 July = 43 August = 51

Some team members will stay for two or three sessions. The group consist of 73 females and 17 (lucky!) males.





The tasks that we aim to complete by working in partnership with the local people between June and August are:

- ★ Build 2 classrooms in Benditai Primary School
- ★ Build 2 classrooms in Ndubusat Secondary School
- ★ Build a community centre in Lelsothet
- ★ Organise summer camps for children
- ★ Run health education programmes in schools
- ★ Organise a variety show on health issues
- ★ Partake in an adult literacy programme
- ★ Run medical projects in three villages
- ★ Run immunisation clinics in Ndubusat Medical Centre
- ★ Distribute and educate about malaria nets
- ★ Construct rainwater collection tanks in villages
- ★ Paint and decorate the Bethel Childrens Home
- ★ Run HIV/AIDS awareness programmes
- ★ Organise youth club activities
- ★ Teach computers
- ★ Provide special needs support for children
- ★ Meet with local community groups to develop income-generating programmes.


